IRIS AT-A-GLANCE

ABOUT

- Grown as a perennial
- · Plant in the fall; Blooms in spring
- Grown from rhizomes or bulbs
- Excellent at attracting pollinators
- Deer and drought resistant

STATS

- Over 300 different varieties; Most popular is bearded or beardless
- Size and spacing varies by plant
- White, purple, burgundy, blue, red, pink, yellow, cream, orange, and even black bloom colors

REQUIREMENTS

- Require full sun of 6-8 hours min.
- Well-draining soil; Amend soil with compost if needed
- Plant when temperatures are around 40-50° F

PLANTING BULBS

- · Loosen soil about 12" deep
- Amend soil with few inches compost
- Place bulbs in soil with pointy end up; Leave 3-4" above bulb tip
- Backfill, lightly tamp down, and water well

PLANTING RHIZOMES

- Loosen soil about 12" deep
- Amend soil with few inches compost
- Create small hill
 in soil and place
 bare-root rhizome
 horizontally on hill with roots

fanning out and down

Backfill, lightly tamp down and water well

MAINTENANCE

- Keep soil moist until roots have established
- Water deeply during growing season but avoid standing water
- Don't use mulch; Causes root rot
- Cut back flower stems to ground but leave foliage; Once yellowing and dying, can then remove
- Cut back to 4-5" before winter

ISSUES

- Aphids, iris borers, nematodes, slug, snails, or thrips
- · Mold, bacterial soft rot, & leaf spot
- · Rodents digging up roots

MISC

- · May not bloom the first year
- Need to be divided every 3-5 years
